

Coors Cup Fellowship Information

The goal of the Coors Cup Fellowship Program is to help subsidize registered tournament players who otherwise might not be able to attend the tournament.

All applications will be reviewed by the Coors Cup Fellowship Committee. The bases for review will be the three pillars of:

1. Athletic Achievement

Applicant must be an active participant in organized hockey at any level, striving for excellence in achievement and fair play.

2. Community Involvement

The awards committee recognizes the significance of community service. Applicants are required to provide details of their community participation and charitable activities.

3. Financial Need

The awards committee shall assess the applicant's financial needs and costs associated with playing in the tournament.

The following criteria must be met by all recipients of a Coors Cup Fellowship:

- 1) Must be registered or plan to register to play in the Coors Cup Tournament. Any monies awarded will first be used to pay registration fees for unregistered recipients. Only players are eligible for this award.
- 2) Must complete a Fellowship Application and submit it by the August 10, 2009.
- 3) Must submit a Letter of Support by a member of their hockey organization by August 10, 2009.
- 4) By signing and submitting this application, the applicant agrees to abide by the Coors Cup Fellowship criteria.
- 5) A fellowship recipient who is subsequently unable to attend the Coors Cup must forfeit the award and return it to the Coors Cup Committee.
- 6) The fellowship review committee reserves the right to request additional information from the applicant after reviewing the application in order to clarify or expand on the answers given.
- 7) A total of 5 fellowships of \$200 each will be awarded on August 15, 2009. Local recipients who apply would be eligible to have their registration fees covered and would not be included with the five who received fellowships. Recipients will be notified via email.
- 8) If the above fellowship criteria are not met, the fellowship recipient may be liable to the Coors Cup Committee for the cash value of the award.
- 9) Fellowship recipients should expect to receive a volunteer assignment from the Volunteer Coordinator.
